
Saline County/Salina Downtown Campus

Saline County and the City of Salina have a long tradition of inter-governmental cooperation, including in the siting of facilities. Since 1969, "city hall" and the "county courthouse" have been the same building - an award-winning cooperative project that is at the heart of a multi-block campus of local government facilities in downtown Salina.

As the needs of both agencies have changed, space in this shared facility has become premium real estate. Relocation of other uses has opened up opportunities to build upon this history of cooperation for improved customer experiences.



Improve services with modern, safe facilities

Challenges and opportunities with current facilities include:



Current buildings were not designed for security screening nor modern fire suppression.



The coronavirus pandemic highlighted the need for new work spaces - especially in the Health Department.



The County and the City each have a large building with no identified future use.



Recognizing this confluence of needs and opportunities, both County and City Commissions agreed to evaluate the most efficient locations and best approach.

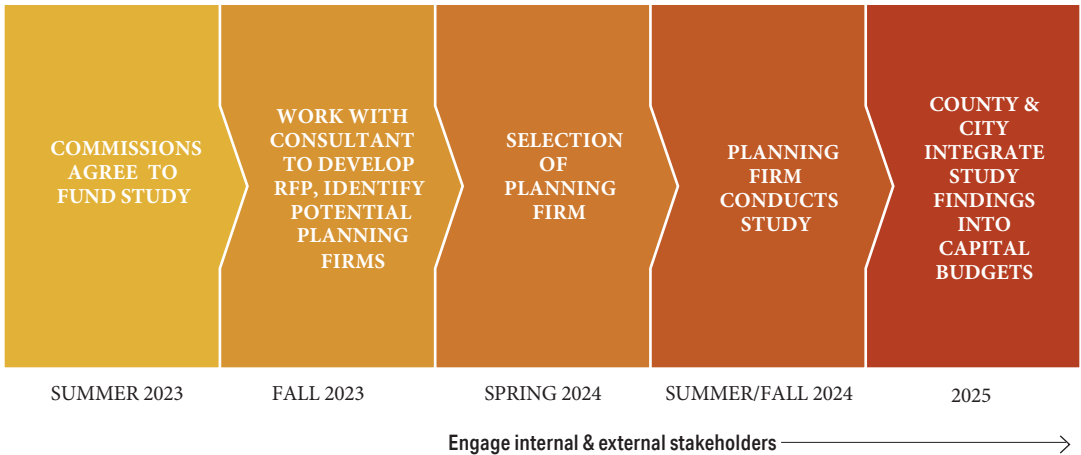
Downtown Campus Study Area
